

The Death Penalty Information Center's <u>2019 Year End Report</u> was released on December 17, 2019 and received extensive coverage in hundreds of print, online, television, and radio news outlets across the United States and around the world.

Coverage highlighted that 2019 marked the fifth consecutive year with fewer than 30 executions and 50 death sentences. Many media outlets noted that half of all U.S. states have abolished the death penalty or now prohibit executions. The report also emphasized that even as the number of death sentences and executions had dramatically fallen, that decline had not reduced the death penalty's discriminatory and arbitrary nature when it was applied. The report noted that rather than reserving executions and death sentences for the worst of the worst crimes and offenders, capital punishment was instead disproportionately meted out in 2019 in cases involving the most vulnerable defendants and prisoners and the least reliable judicial process.

An Associated Press story that was carried by over 250 outlets noted that "[t]wenty of the 22 executions in 2019 took place in five Southern states, led by Texas with 9." That article also includes a compelling quote from Executive Director Robert Dunham: "The death penalty is disappearing from whole regions of the country and eroding in others, but the death penalty is persisting among outlier jurisdictions." The Year End Report's release was covered by the four largest wire services in the world: The Associated Press, Reuters, Agence-France Presse, and Agencia EFE.

NPR's Here and Now — distributed across the United States by NPR to over 450 stations, with an estimated 4.5 million weekly listeners — featured a statement from Robert that "[o]f the 22 executions this year, 18 individuals showed evidence of serious mental illness, brain damage or chronic exposure to trauma... And some of them were ages 18 to 21 at the time of the crime." The Washington Post's editorial board tracked the facts in the report closely and concluded: "The death penalty is expensive, unfairly implemented and unworthy of a justice system that strives for equal application of the law. Yet even if it could be applied fairly, state-sponsored killing would be unworthy of a nation founded on the principle of individual dignity." USA Today led with "Death sentences and executions remained at near-historic lows this year while calls for exoneration gripped the nation, according to a new report released Tuesday." As issues of innocence remained at the forefront of national capital punishment practices, many outlets reported that 2019 was almost the year of "executing the innocent"— a line taken directly from Robert's quote in DPIC's press release about the report. For example, the Guardian's article about the report was titled "Capital punishment: 2019 was nearly 'the year of executing the innocent." In an interview with USA Today, Robert said, "We've gotten to the point where Americans accept as a fact that the death penalty risks wrongly convicting and potentially executing people who are innocent...This year dramatically illustrates that issue."

Robert also offered extensive interviews to reporters working locally, many of whom focused on the geographic narrowing of the death penalty. California Matters wrote, "There were 22 executions nationally in 2019, all but one of which was in a Southern state. It was the second fewest since 1991, the Death Penalty Information Center reports." The three death sentences in Cuyahoga County — the highest number of death sentences for a county in 2019 — received notable attention, with at least two original news stories quoting Robert and a third citing the report.
